

## **ASR PROGRAM**

For a limited time, the Edwards Aquifer Authority (EAA) is offering permit holders the opportunity to enroll in the new ASR Program. This new ASR program is a forbearance program, meaning the water enrolled in the program will be neither leased nor pumped and stored into the SAWS Twin Oaks ASR Project as in previous years. In fact, the water you enroll is yours to use, lease, or conserve when the 10-year annual recharge average is above 500,000 acre-feet. Forbearance is only required the year after a determination has been made that the 10-year annual recharge average is at or below 500,000 acre-feet. The last time the 10-year average fell below this trigger was from 1946 - 1959 the most severe drought on record and considered as the drought of record (1951-1956).

This water conservation program is designed to protect springflow for federally listed threatened and endangered species during times of severe, long-term droughts by financially compensating municipal, industrial, and irrigation permit holders who enroll all or part of their groundwater rights for the benefit of the Edwards Aquifer Habitat Conservation Plan (EAHCP).

To ensure that federally listed threatened and endangered species that rely heavily on Comal and San Marcos Springs receive long term springflow protection, the EAA is looking for long term (9-year) commitments by permit holders.



If you wish to help our efforts in protecting springflow and also receive long term financial compensation you must act soon.

## The deadline for enrollment is November 1, 2019 or until enrollment is full.
