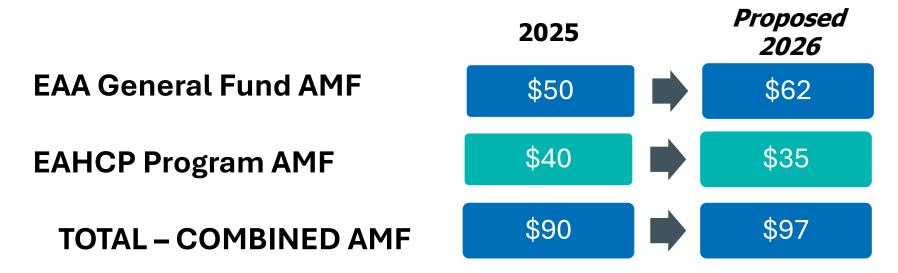

# 2026 Proposed Revenue

# Revenue: Aquifer Management Fees

Agricultural rate remains at \$2/AF as set forth in the Edwards Aquifer Authority Act.

Municipal & Industrial (M&I) combined rate increase from \$90/AF to \$97/AF.



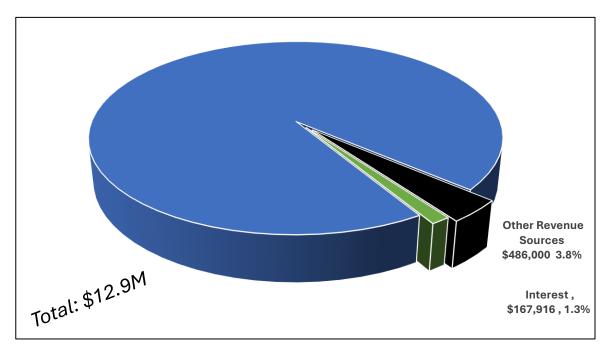

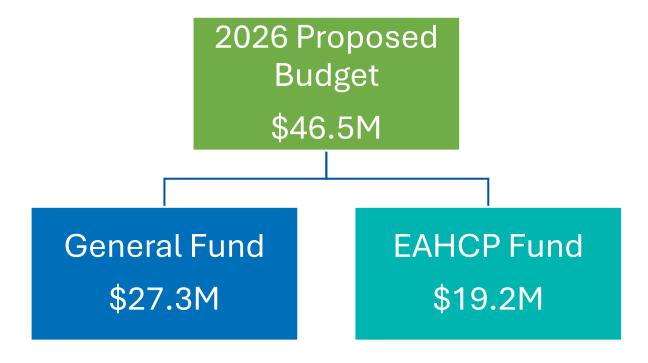

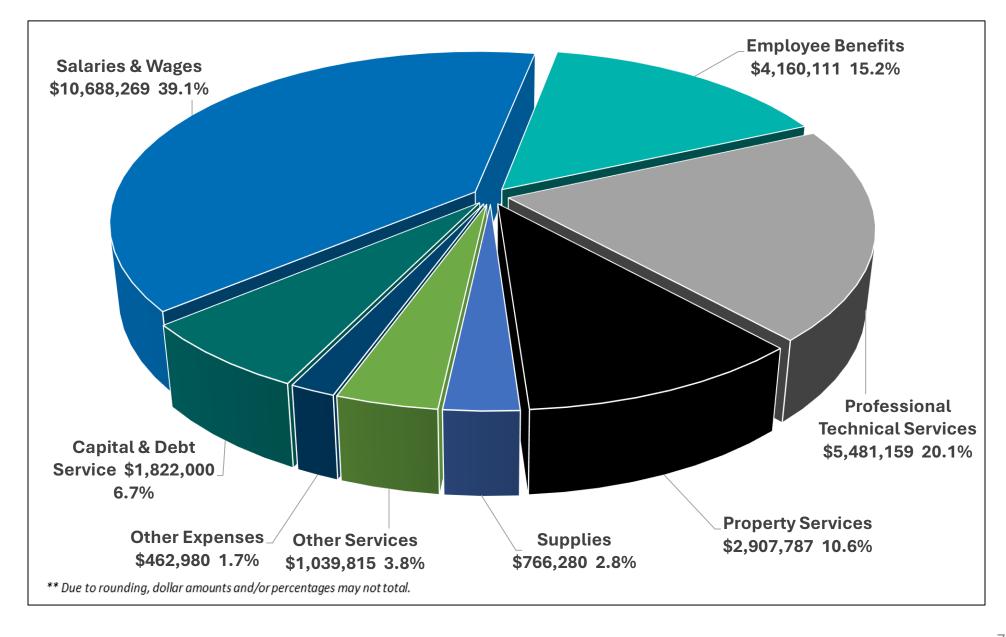

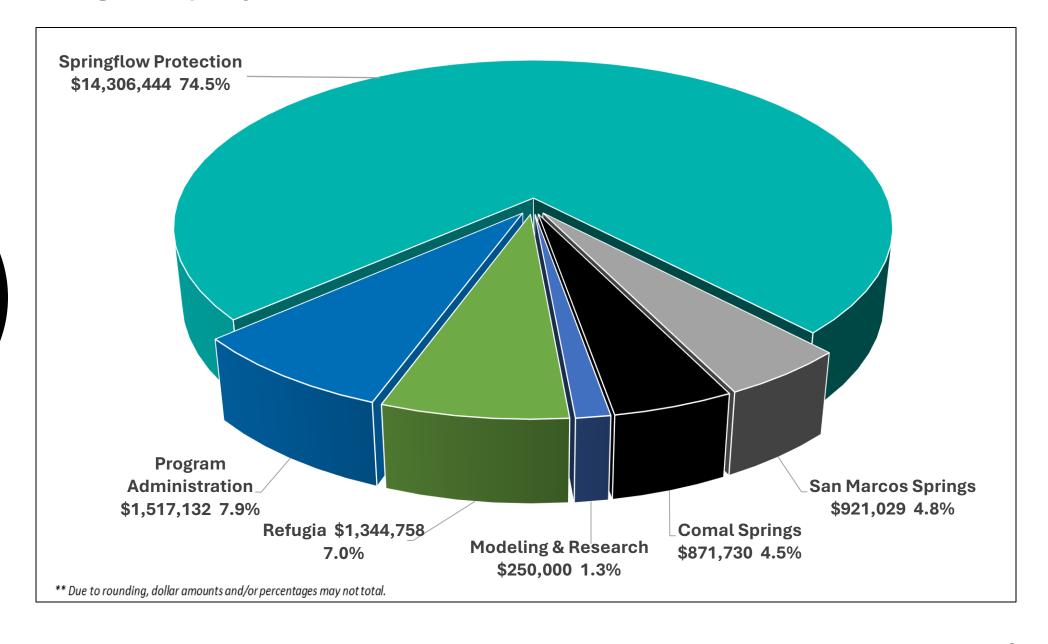

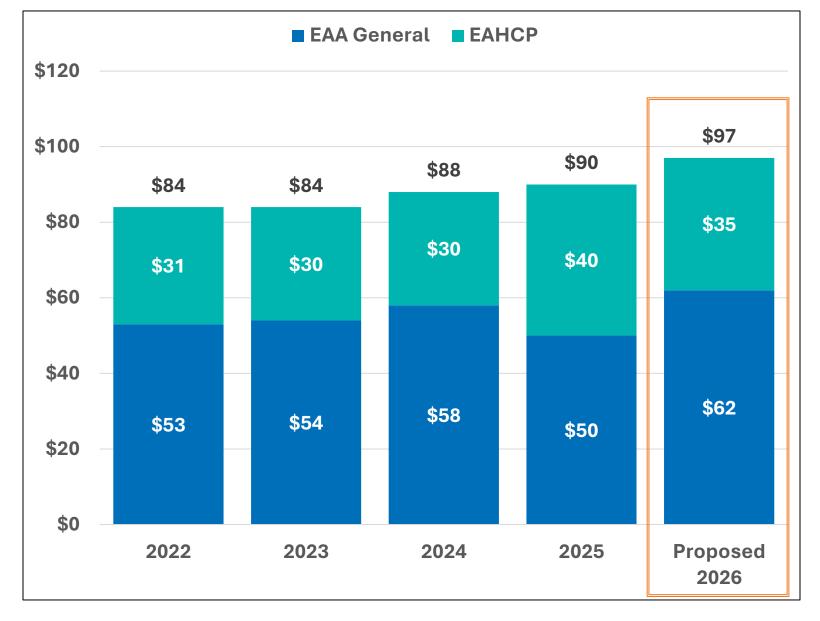

AMF



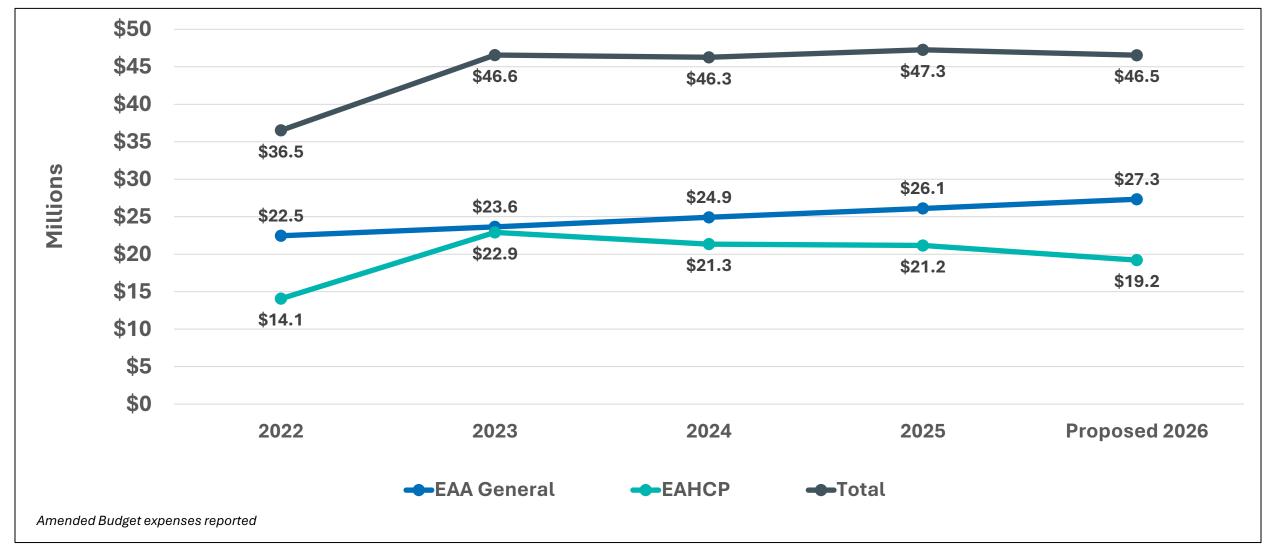

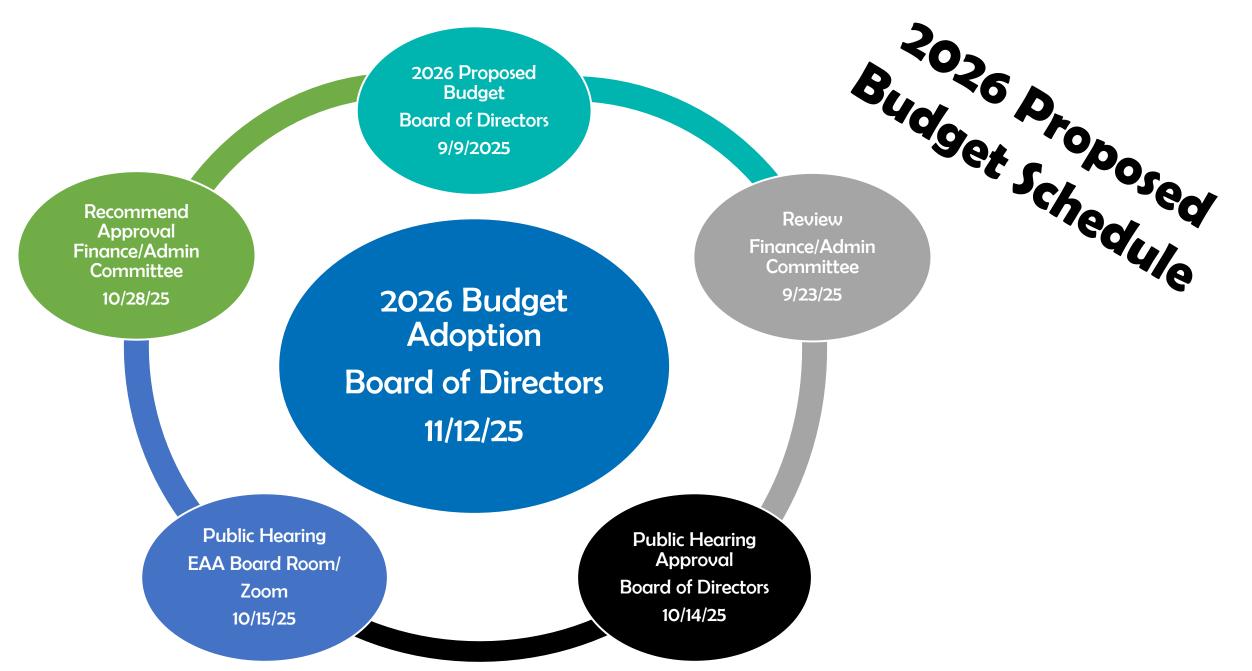
